Staying “Focused” in 2026

Besides picking a new word for the year in January, it's also my tradition to go back and read my February lead article from the previous year. I picked four words last year...*Being Salt and Light!* In that article I placed a quote: *“Lord, help me to be like a shepherd – to lead, nurture, and guide those around me to the Good Shepherd. Lord, help me to be more like the wise men – to hear your call and to use the gift that you have blessed me with to serve others. Lord, help me to be more like Joseph and Mary – to rely on you completely and trust you throughout each day. Lord, help me to be more like Jesus – to show love, kindness, understanding, and forgiveness. Lord, may the glory and wonder of the Nativity lead us through all seasons of the year.”*

So, my question for you this year is this: How were YOU salt? How were YOU light? How were YOU these four words for Central? Our visitors? Our neighbors? Our community?

As I spent time thinking about my word for 2026, I decided to get inspiration by listening to my favorite piece of music. It's a piece I've written about in the past...*Gabriel's Oboe*. This time when I searched for a new recording, I literally was stopped in my tracks when I clicked “play” on the YouTube. This is by far the best recording I've ever heard. Gabriel's Oboe is the main musical theme in the movie “The Mission:” The basic themes of “The Mission” revolve around faith vs. violence, redemption, and the conflict between spiritual ideals and political reality, exploring how individuals and the Church grapple with protecting indigenous people from the exploitation by Spanish/Portuguese empires, highlights sacrifice, love, and the struggle for dignity against overwhelming power. Further research found that the composer and vocal artist, Sarah Brightman, together put words to that haunting melody *after* the movie had been released. Their lyrics nailed my word for 2026. You will find the text in the box below. *Gabriel's Oboe* represents the power of music, of faith, and of love that will bridge cultures and disarm hostility. But the words that were later added, symbolized *empowerment* and *spiritual connection*, used to show the enduring spirit despite destruction that is happening in our world.

After knowing what Rob's sermon series would be in January, the book he would base it on, and the words written to *Gabriel's Oboe*, I had my word! My word is also *perfect* for our church...a church embracing immigration.

FOCUS is my word for 2026. This word would serve as a powerful anchor for setting my goals, aligning my energy, and making decisions by emphasizing priorities and eliminating noise, making it highly relevant for me personally. I liked the word so much that I decided to make a list...I called it my 26 for 2026. I started listing my 26 areas I personally wanted to “focus” on during 2026. As I started making my list, I realized that I was not only focusing on me, but on our church and the areas we as a church already had on our “Vision Roadmap for 2026”. Here's that list: Intentionally *invite* and *include* Nelson Neighborhood Improvement Association, *ask* community partners how to use our space, *create* new energy in worship; *be present, visible and welcoming*; *addressing* our needs, resources, relationships, and communication; *being* a spiritual hub, and *partnering* with our diverse community. Perhaps you too would like to “focus” on things this year that not only include you, but our church, and yes, our world that is totally plagued with hate and so much unrest.

Like last year, I'll leave one last thought for each of you to “chew on” personally during 2026: **“Without ‘Focus’, none of us will be on the path to what matters! Let's still be shepherds, wise men, Mary, Joseph, and Jesus for Central during 2026 ... but let's also be a Ruth, a Naomi, and a Boaz for our church, for our world, and for ourselves.”**
